

+ Q. My student has allergies or food concerns. How is that addressed?

+ Q. What should I do if my student has health issues or concerns?

- Q. How should I handle medication?

A. We do not administer prescription medications during day programs and will only provide children with over-the-counter medications (i.e. ibuprofen) if you permit the nurse to do so. If your child has a prescription that they need during the day, they must carry it and administer it themselves. If your child requires a narcotic prescription during the day, a parent/guardian will need to come to campus to administer this unless advance, specific arrangements are made directly with the IMSA health office.

For residential programs, campers will turn in their prescription medications to the Residential Counselor (RC) upon arrival on campus. The nurse and RC will coordinate prescription medication dispensing.
